In May 1918 Peabody joined the Red Cross, going to France in June with the Motor Truck Division. He was later commissioned a Lieutenant in the A. E. F., was shell shocked and discharged for disability due thereto. He returned to the United States in October but did not fully recover and two months later, December 20th, 1918, died from pneumonia, contracted as a direct result of his injuries on the field of battle.



GRISWOLD HAVEN PEABODY

1896-1899

GRISWOLD HAVEN PEABODY, the son of Stephen ('71-'74) and of Nina Haven Peabody, was born in New York on April 24th, 1883. He entered St. Paul's with his brother, Stephen, Jr., in 1896, following in the footsteps of his father and of his uncle Richard, ('71-'75). Griswold was a merry hearted lad, full of fun and energy, an unassuming boy with a quiet sense of humor. Being of slight build, Peabody did not take any prominent part in athletics, but was generally well liked. It was owing to the fact that he did not enjoy good health while at School that he did not complete his School course and go on to college.

After leaving the School he was for a while in business with the brokerage firm of Edward P. Sweet and Company,
