Noodlebib! What is it?

Noodlebib guides researchers through the process of creating a citation. It also makes it possible to attach a virtual notecard to each citation.

How is it accessed?

Simply visit: <http://www.noodletools.com/login.php>

Log in, or, if you do not yet have an account, use this same page to create one.

***Note:** You must be logged in on the SPS network to first create your account. After that, Noodlebib is accessible anytime, anywhere through any browser.*



Choose your citation style (at SPS, we typically use MLA Advanced) and give your list a name.

Create a New List

Select the bibliographic style (MLA, APA, or Chicago/Turabian) you wish to use and enter a name for your list between styles once you have begun adding citations, so choose carefully (and ask your librarian for help).

List style:

- MLA Advanced**
 - follows the *MLA Handbook, 6th ed.*
- MLA Starter**
 - simpler forms
 - only the most basic citation types available
- APA Advanced**
 - follows the *APA Publication Manual, 5th ed.*
- Chicago/Turabian Advanced**
 - bibliography/notes formatting
 - follows Turabian's *A Manual for Writers of Research Papers*

Description: Humanities VBigPaper
For example, "History 101 report on George Washington"

From the menu bar, select the type of material you wish to cite.

Noodlebib will ask you for information about that source.

Newspaper or newswire

- a newspaper column
- an article from a newswire
- an editorial, letter to the editor, cartoon, or comic strip
- an advertisement
- a transcript of an interview or speech
- a photograph
- a review
- an article reproduced online (often as part of a library)
- content available on electronic media, microfiche, or video

But if not, your source may be...

Reprint in a book
A newspaper article reprinted in a book or collection (which may be available in a library)

Confirm and tell Noodlebib more about the source.

- An article

- An editorial
