### **How to Include Other Sources in Your Works Cited List**

In your Works Cited list, double space all entries and list in alphabetical order by author's last name. For cases not covered here, please check the *MLA Handbook* (7th ed.) 193-211. In addition, you may want to consult the Noodlebib Citation Guide available [HERE](#).

### **Scriptural Citations**

For more information on this topic, consult *MLA Handbook* (7th ed.) page 164 section 5.5.11 and also 226-228 section 6.4.8. You may abbreviate the version of the Bible you are citing. For information on accepted abbreviations of Biblical books, consult *MLA Handbook* 251-253. For inclusion in your works cited list, provide the same information as you would for any other book.
